United States Embassy Student Visa Interview Topics to Prepare for in Advance

Student may bring a supporting document and a set of answers to these items to the Embassy interview.

Student needs to have the I-20 form from the college he/she will be attending. Student should know what is on the I-20 related to program of study, education path to prepare for the career and desires after education. The I-20 process has a definite timeline for getting the visa for each cycle. Be aware of the window of time for applying for the education visa. Student must be able to demonstrate he/she is prepared to study at a college in the United States. Take to the interview grade reports from the high school, any academic honors earned,
and official high school transcript.
The student must be able to articulate the day, month and year they graduated from high school
Bring to the interview:
 Personal financial statements (bank records, savings account balances, income sources) Information from the student sponsors Bank records, letters of commitment showing sponsors address, financial dollar amount committed to the student How does the student know this sponsor, how long have they known each other, what type of communications have been done with the sponsor Copies of scholarships received or applied for from the college they want to attend
Students will be expected to articulate the program of study that each has declared on the I-20 form and the educational journey it will take to prepare for the career/education goal. The education will require one of several pathways including: Career and Technical Education

 Requires two-years of study in an occupational program and then enter the workforce. (Examples Include: nursing, business, health information systems, agriculture, automotive, etc.) Academic Transfer
 Requires two years of study at Northeast Community College and then transfer to a four-year college. (Examples include: Pre-Nursing, Pre-Medicine, Pre- Optometry, Pre-Law, Pre-Engineering, etc.)
