





SHANA BEATTIE

AG-ceptional Woman of the Year 2018

Shana Beattie was born and raised in north central Florida where her family is still involved in agriculture. Her father was a rancher who raised cattle and was also in the livestock hauling business. She and her four siblings grew up in a rural area and were actively involved in 4-H and FFA. Beattie was involved in meats judging in high school and was recognized at state and national competitions and was a member of the University of Florida's Intercollegiate Meats Judging Team. Florida is where she received her Bachelor of Science majoring in Animal Science. While in college she met her future husband, Bart Beattie, who was attending the University of Nebraska-Lincoln at the time. They met while both working during a summer internship in North Carolina. "I still bleed orange and blue which has been interesting living in Nebraska for twenty-three years. I'm true to my roots, but I have raised a bunch of little 'Cornhuskers,' so I've done my part. However, I still root for orange and blue on Saturdays."

Bart and Shana Beattie operate Beattie Family Farms, along with Bart's parents Jeff and Nanette Beattie. It is a diversified operation that includes a crop rotation of corn, soybeans, and alfalfa. They also partner in a 10,000 head sow farm which is their source for weaned pigs to fill the family's wean-to-finish swine barns. Additionally, they own a commercial cow/calf ranching operation near Sumner in central Nebraska. The Beattie's employ 15 people.

"I'm the fifth generation to be on this family farm and I'm very proud of that. I have a lot of pride in the heritage that my grandfathers started years ago," Bart Beattie said. "We've had the opportunity to be here for over twenty years and it's just been a great opportunity to get to grow our operation with Shana, who has been very involved from the beginning."

Shana Beattie's primary role in the operation presently involves inventory management of both swine and beef as well as managing office personnel. Previously, she has worked with cattle and assisted during harvest driving grain carts, in addition to other jobs. She's a member of the board of directors of the Nebraska Pork Producers Association where she serves as the Vice President for the state association.

The Beatties have four children, Mekenzie is the oldest and a sophomore at UNL majoring in Agriculture Business, Mattison is a sophomore in High School, Bart Jr. is an eighth grader, and Preston is a sixth grader, all at SEM Schools. All of the children are actively involved in the farm when not busy in their variety of activities. Bart and Shana spend most of their time off the farm

at volleyball, football, and basketball games. Additionally, the family is actively involved in raising and exhibiting show cattle at local, state and national shows.

Serving in a leadership position for Pork Producers and being named the AGceptional Women of the Year has really allowed me to appreciate agriculture in Nebraska. In this state we are blessed with so many resources that make growing food and feed such a sense of accomplishment and gives farmers purpose.

However, in my nearly 25 years living and farming in Nebraska I can honestly say that 2019 was the most historic with weather and trade challenges. For many farmers and ranchers, it was catastrophic, while for others it was challenging and an inconvenience. I pray that going forward, 2019 will be a year we will tell our grandkids about and never have to live through again. The resiliency and compassion that Nebraskans expressed during these trying times truly showed who we are and what we will fight for. Agriculture will always have it's weather, trade, and market challenges, but as Nebraska Farmers each and every day we will be thankful for our land and resources God has provided, thus making us a world leader in growing the best protein, feed and fiber. I could not be more thrilled to be part of this opportunity with the women in Nebraska Agriculture.

- Increase yield potential by watering the acres that need them the most.
- Increase plant health in areas that tend to get wet feet.

Nexus is the capital campaign for new ag facilities at Northeast Community College to replace the 100-year-old repurposed dairy barn currently used for animal science and veterinary technology classes and farm and livestock operations.

The Acklie Charitable Foundation has pledged \$5 million toward the \$23 million needed for the initial construction during Phase 1. Financial support is being sought from Northeast employees, state livestock organizations, area banks, cooperatives, foundations, agribusinesses, and individuals.

The College has saved resources for this project and will invest \$10 million, but additional contributions are needed to guarantee groundbreaking in the Spring of 2020.

Phase 1 of the plan includes a new veterinary technology building and farm site with a large animal handling facility and a farm operations building.
