The Northeast Community College Board of Governors met for its regular session Board Meeting on Thursday, August 10, 2023 in Suites F & G of the Lifelong Learning Center, located on the campus of Northeast Community College, 801 East Benjamin Avenue, Norfolk, NE.

1. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Chairperson Julie Robinson convened the meeting at 10:34 a.m. and led the assembly in pledging their allegiance to the flag of the United States of America.

2. ADOPT AGENDA

MOTION by Del Ames, **SECONDED** by Donovan Ellis to adopt the Agenda of the August 10, 2023 Regular Meeting. Official Notice of the meeting was posted on the Northeast Community College website and published in the *Norfolk Daily News* on Friday, August 4, 2023.

3. OPEN MEETINGS ACT

A copy of the Nebraska Open Meetings Act is posted on the table at the back of the meeting room, along with a copy of the August 10th Board of Governors Meeting agenda and all printable supporting documents.

4. BOARD EDUCATION AND INFORMATION

4.1 Administrative Services Report

- 4.1.1 A brief review was given to the financial report for the period ending July 31, 2023. Items of significance within the paid bills report include payment to Huff Construction for the Lifelong Learning Center remodel; Hespe Construction for their work on the Simon Hall and Ag/Allied Health remodel that will be utilized by the drafting department; Ellucian for cloud software subscriptions; and an insurance renewal payment.
- 4.1.2 Review was given to five-year budget projection scenarios and preliminary discussion was held regarding the proposed general fund and capital fund budgets. Some of the anticipated budget increases are a result of our investment in employees and our investment in technology, two of our most valuable assets.

At 11:36 p.m., Chairperson Robinson declared the meeting recessed for lunch, followed by participation in the Dr. G. Tom (Doc) Surber room dedication.

Chairperson Robinson declared the Board in session at 1:44 p.m.

Data was received in April regarding estimated valuations for 2023 which revealed increased valuations. During the discussion, and taking increased valuations into consideration, board members expressed their desire to keep Northeast's levy flat for the next fiscal year.

Certified valuations will not be received until August 20th and taxing entities need to submit to the county clerk by the end of August if they will be participating in the joint public meeting, scheduled for September 21st. Adopted budgets must be submitted to the State Auditor by September 30th. Once valuations are certified, an electronic update with all information will be provided to the Board of Governors.

An action item that is included in today's agenda is regarding the general fund budget limit authority. It is fiscally prudent to approve the one (1) percent increase in the total 2023-2024 general fund budget limit authority to assure that Northeast continues to have the authority to receive all the restricted funds for which the College is eligible.

5. PUBLIC COMMENT on Board Education and Information

Chairperson Robinson advised that individuals commenting on Board Education and Information items are allowed three minutes each. No constituents were in attendance to address the board with a public comment.

6. BOARD EDUCATION AND INFORMATION

- 6.1 <u>Development/External Relations Report</u>
 - S.1.1 NCCA Board of Directors conducted their third quarter board meeting and strategic planning workshop in Lincoln on August 7th. A great deal of discussion was held regarding the mill levy with the understanding that each community college must operate on what their respective Board of Governors decides is best for their area. It was also stated that no community college should speak on behalf of another community college's needs or requirements.

The NCCA Board of Directors and CEOs will meet on October 2nd in Grand Island to learn where each community college set their mill levy and discuss the NCCA legislative priorities for 2024.

Reminder provided that the NCCA Annual Meeting will be held November 4-5, 2023 in North Platte. Tours have been lined up in North Platte prior to the start of the annual meeting.

6.1.2 Jee Hang Lee, ACCT's president and CEO is in his 2nd year of leadership and has done a great job of hitting the ground running. ACCT's budget has expanded greatly due to Jee Hang's connections.

Community colleges are positioned very well with the farm bill due to the work of ACCT, including Carrie Warick-Smith. There is concern that the FAFSA Simplification Act may have a negative impact on students receiving federal financial aid. This is in the House and Senate and cannot be changed by the Department of Education.

Steve Anderson is in the first year of his second term serving on the ACCT Board of Directors. ACCT's process has changed, and individuals interested in serving on the board must have a year's worth of involvement with ACCT before they can put their name in to serve on the ACCT board. Steve encouraged anyone interested in serving on the ACCT board to consider attending upcoming ACCT events.

6.1.3 President's update

- Fall 2023 enrollment preview reveals Northeast is up 2.8% in headcount and down .1% in credit hours. The 10th day fall enrollment report will be provided in September.
- Northeast Community College is one of eight businesses involved in the Norfolk Area Childcare Co-op. The Co-op is being established in an effort to provide more childcare in the greater Norfolk area.
- President Barrett continues to meet with state senators.
- NSWERS Dual Enrollment Report will be released on August 15th.
- South Sioux City Phase I Groundbreaking will be held on August 31st at 10:00 a.m.
- Northeast's 50th Anniversary celebration is scheduled for September 23rd, 12:00-4:00 p.m.

8.2 Ownership Linkage Committee

The Ownership Linkage Committee met on July 31st for the purpose of preparing/strategizing for the August 7th NCCA strategic planning session.

9. MONITORING REPORT

9.1 EL-04, Planning

Accepted with the following notations: Enrollment management is tied to the college budget and the administration is committed to having this in place a year from now; the Master Site and Facilities Plan needs to be updated but this has not been budgeted for in the next fiscal year; and significant progress has been made in the past year regarding succession planning. Chairperson Robinson suggested that the changing climate of the community college funding needs to be added as an environmental factor.

Following review and discussion of EL-04, <u>Planning</u>, the Summary of Recorded Board Decisions RE: Monitoring Reports was completed and is filed in the Board of Governors Teams site.
