## **MINUTES**

- 1. Steve Anderson, member of the Governance Committee, convened the meeting at 2:04 p.m. in Room 1108B of the College Welcome Center.
- 2. Recommended approval of the Minutes of the November 8, 2018 meeting with a correction to reflect that Terry Nelson convened the meeting.
- 3. Lynne Koski reported that revisions to BP-3010, <u>Use and Scheduling of College Facilities and Property</u>, streamline and centralize the process. Julie Robinson inquired if this was for outside entities and Mrs. Koski clarified that this policy is for internal and external constituents.
  - A consensus was reached by the Governance Committee to recommend to the Board of Governors to accept the FIRST READING of revisions to BP-3010, <u>Use and Scheduling of College Facilities and Property</u>.
- 4. BP-3270, <u>Loitering</u>, is being established to provide guidance to faculty and staff on how to handle situations and provides reinforcement for contacting Sioux City Night Patrol or law enforcement.
  - A consensus was reached by the Governance Committee to recommend to the Board of Governors to accept the FIRST READING of BP-3270, Loitering.
- 5. A consensus was reached by the Governance Committee to recommend to the Board of Governors to accept the FIRST READING of revisions to BP-7410, Employee Leave.

Revisions were made in an effort to have one policy that governs all leaves authorized by Northeast to its staff.

- 6. With the aforementioned policy governing all authorized leaves, it is not necessary to have individual policies for each procedure. A consensus was reached by the Governance Committee to recommend to the Board of Governors to accept the FIRST READING for the deletion of the following:

- 8. A consensus was reached by the Governance Committee to recommend to the Board of Governors to elect Steve Anderson and Gene Willers to serve as the 2019 Nebraska Community College Association (NCCA) Board of Directors representatives, with the remainder of the board serving as alternates.
- 9. Review was given to 2019 Board of Governors meeting dates.
- 10. A brief review was given to the agenda for the New Board Member Orientation that will be conducted on Monday, December 17, 2018, for Mr. Donovan Ellis. Greg Adams, NCCA Executive Director, will join the orientation session via Zoom and provide information at the state level. Dirk Petersen, Steve Anderson, and Terry Nelson will lead the discussion during the remainder of the meeting.
- 11. In other business, Dirk Petersen inquired if there is more, something similar to Pathways 2 Tomorrow or Fridays @ Northeast, that Northeast could provide for local seniors who have met their high school requirements. Dr. Chipps and Mr. Blaylock stated that President's Cabinet will continue to discuss and explore opportunities.

A future presentation will be provided to the Board of Governors to better explain the difference between Pathways and Career Academies.

Also in other business, Dr. Tracy Kruse reported that although we did not get both of the revisions passed in the Farm Bill as originally proposed, significant process was made which will allow us to continue to grow our work with the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Rural Development and Natural Resources Conservation Service.
