

**2023 Nebraska FFA Envirothon Contest
Districts 3, 4 & 10
Northeast Community College, Norfolk, NE**

Five-person team effort, top team from each regional boundary will qualify for the State Contest. Teams must be registered to compete. No walk-in's the day of the event.

The purpose of the competition is to provide students with an interest in natural resources, a forum for competing against other students in the areas of water, soil, range, forestry, policy, wildlife, and a special topic. The objective of the Envirothon is to test the environmental knowledge and understanding of high school students on natural resource issues and to give them a chance to apply what they have learned in the classroom to real life issues. The Envirothon was established as a competitive, problem-solving, natural resource event to challenge high school students about the environment.
